Dear Parents-Guardians:

We hope everyone has had a great summer. School is just around the corner and we wanted to touch base with everyone. The first day of school for the 2018-2019 school year is Wednesday, August 22nd. All students need to be at TCCS no later than 7:55 AM. The school day starts at 8:00AM. and ends at 3:11PM.

All students are responsible to complete their math and reading summer homework. It is worth 25% of your first quarter grade, so make sure you complete the work. All of the work should be review from last year. Completed work is due the first week of school.

We will have an OPEN HOUSE on MONDAY, AUGUST 20, 2018 from 3:00pm to 6:00 pm. We will have sessions for all parents to attend for Handbook Review, School safety, updates for the new school year at 3:30 PM and at 5:00 PM. Please plan to attend one of these meeting. 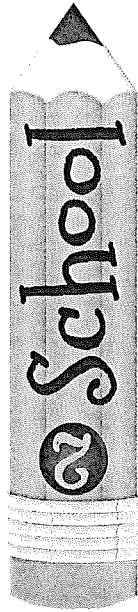

School Safety Informational Meeting

Introduction to ALICE

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Tidioute Community Charter is adopting a new strategy for lockdown procedures known as ALICE. ALICE is an acronym for Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter and Evacuate.

Prior to ALICE, lockdown procedures involved the staff locking their doors, moving the students to a part of the room where they could not be seen, and quietly remaining there until an “all clear” announcement was given. The main objective of the ALICE program is to provide students and staff with OPTIONS to increase their chance of survival during an active shooter or active threat emergency. The philosophy of ALICE is to use technology and information in a way so that staff and students can make informed decisions in a crisis, move as far as possible from the danger zone, and provide realistic training so that those involved in a crisis have a better chance of surviving.

The ALICE plan will be implemented at TCCS with age-appropriate, kid-friendly language at the elementary level by their teachers and the middle/high school will also receive training from teachers and Certified Alice Trainers.

The introduction and first ALICE training of students will take place in the upcoming semester. Drills and practice will follow after all the students are trained. Your input and assistance will be vital for this program to be successful. Therefore, TCCS will be holding an ALICE presentation and Q&A during the TCCS Open House:

A few reminders from the health office

Please be sure that your child's immunizations are up to date. Children in grades K, 7, and 12 have to have boosters before school. If they are not up to date by the first day of school, they cannot come to school without a medical certificate filled out by their physician with a plan to get the required doses. Letters have gone home at the end of last school year and over the summer to remind you of this if your child needed immunizations.

If your child needs to take medication during school, the medication administration consent needs to be filled out by you and your child's physician and the medication must be brought to school by a parent/guardian in the original labeled bottle. Please do not ever send medication into school with your child as it is a violation of school policy and your child could face disciplinary action and it poses a safety risk to your child and other children.

Students in grades K, 3, and 7 are required to have a dental exam. If they've had an exam since September 2017, please ask your dentist to fax a copy to the school. If you do not have a private dentist, the mobile dentist can see your child during the school year. Paperwork will be sent home at a later date. If your child does not have a private dentist and you choose not to utilize the mobile dentist, the school dentist can complete the exam.

Students in grades K, 6, and 11 are required to have a physical exam. If they've had an exam since September 2017, please ask your physician to fax a copy to the school. If you do not have a physician, the school physician can complete the exam. Paperwork will be sent home at a later date.

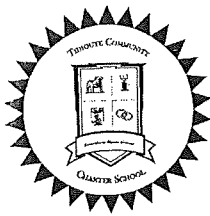
